Why We Have a Dress Code

The House Committee of the Hibernian Golf Club has adopted the dress code to preserve the Club's ambience as a respectable, family-oriented destination for intimate dinners, business functions, and family gatherings. The Committee wants all members to feel comfortable and proud of the Club as a first-class destination.

Please always err on the conservative side when contemplating what to wear at the Club.

#### Key Rules:

- **Tuck shirts in**
- **Cover midriffs**
- **No excessively tight, short or baggy clothing**
- **No rubber sandals**
- **No athletic attire**
- **Soft spikes only.**
- **No Jeans of any type anywhere.**
- **No trouser bottoms tucked inside socks.**
- **No collarless shirts.**
- **Shorts must be tailored and below the knee.**
- **Socks must be worn at all times.**
- **No caps/hats inside the clubhouse.**

#### Dining

Dress code for the Dining Room:

- Acceptable attire for gentlemen, is business casual, which includes collared shirts, banded collared dress shirts or turtleneck shirts with dress slacks. Jackets are optional on Monday through Friday evenings.
- On Saturday evenings and Sunday lunch, gentlemen are required to wear jackets with a collared shirt, banded collar dress shirt or turtleneck shirt. Ties are optional for all evenings and Sunday lunch. However, jeans of any type, shorts and athletic attire are not permitted at any time in the Dining Room
- Corresponding appropriate attire for ladies during these dining times is expected.

#### Dress code for the Grill and the Lounge

These rules apply to all members and guests

- No frayed hems or ripped or torn parts on pants, shorts or skirts are allowed.
- Collared shirts or banded collar dress shirts are required for gentlemen. Appropriate blouses are required for ladies. Turtlenecks, jacketed warm-up tops and pants are acceptable.
- Tee shirts and sweatshirts are not permitted
- Casual attire is acceptable. No gym clothes of any type are allowed
- Caps, hats and visors are not permitted for men or ladies in the social and dining areas of the Club
- Midsections must be covered
- Excessively tight, short or baggy clothing is considered inappropriate

Golf shoes & caps are not allowed in the dining/bar areas

#### Golf Attire

Dress code for golfers

- All golfers must wear proper golfing attire when playing golf or using the practice facilities. This includes the putting green and all practice areas
- Jeans, cut-offs, tennis shorts, gym shorts, tee shirts, tank tops, halter tops, hoodies and work-out wear are examples of improper golfing attire
- Shorts must be at least 16" at the outseam
- Shoes are mandatory and metal spikes are not permitted
- With the exception of specialty items, all clothing that is carried in the Golf Shop is considered proper attire.

The starter, marshals and professional staff will request that improper attire be replaced before play or practice. Please note that the Committee may amend what is considered proper attire.
